

HOST A VOTER REGISTRATION DRIVE AT YOUR SCHOOL BETWEEN SEPTEMBER 18TH OCTOBER 10TH

HOW-TO GUIDE

- **Get permission** from your school administrators to hold a voter registration drive on campus. Decide with them where and when it will be held, such as in classrooms, the cafeteria, or during an event1.
- Gather the materials you need for the drive, such as paper forms, pens, clipboards, (if not using online registration), or set up a computer with online registration form at https://olvr.ohiosos.gov/
- Recruit and train volunteers to help you with the drive. Make sure they know how to register voters, answer questions, and follow the rules.
- **Promote your drive** to your school community. Use social media, flyers, posters, announcements, or word-of-mouth to spread the word about your drive and encourage people to register.
- Set up a table on the day of the drive in a high-traffic area and greet potential voters. Ask them if they are registered to vote or need to update their information. Help them fill out the forms or use the online tools to register themselves.
- After the drive, submit any completed paper forms to your local board of elections office.
- Become a poll worker! Students 17 and older can work the polls on election day and earn a \$100 plus an excused day off of school!





IF YOU'RE AT LEAST 17 AND IN HIGH SCHOOL YOU CAN BE A POLL WORKER

Ohio's Youth at the Booth (YAB) Program allows seniors who are 17 or older to work at the polls!

- Earn between \$100 \$150
- Get a day off school with an excused absence
- Recieve community service hours & extra credit

The Ohio Secretary of State's 'Youth at the Booth' initiative is designed to help get high school students engaged in Ohio's elections process while earning extra cash and volunteer hours.
